From the Vicar

Our Lenten Journey is nearing its end. I pray in this Lent each of us has availed ourselves of the God-given opportunities to "grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ." (2 Peter 3:18) Sometimes, I fear, we may begin to think of ourselves as "done." We have navigated the education system, worked hard and with a measure of success in our chosen professions, married, raised children, maintained homes, paid taxes, and been faithful in attending and supporting our church. After all the work, is it unreasonable to expect a time of rest from our labors?

Of course, when it comes to income producing activities, many of us can and do rest from those labors, but in most cases, we use the time and energy freed up from financially gainful employment to pursue other beneficial activities. This can be anything from volunteer work to enjoying and helping family to hobbies such as gardening or studying some new area of knowledge.

All of these are good uses for our newly freed up time and energy, but there is one thing we must never seek to "rest" from, our spiritual growth. Neither you nor I are "done," unless or until we are fully "conformed to the image of Christ." When someone looks at us, do they see Christ? Or is the image of Christ we reflect to the world somewhat dimmed, or distorted, or fuzzy? Speaking for myself, I know I still have spiritual work to do, or perhaps better, to actively cooperate with the Holy Ghost as he does His work. I would be surprised if I were the only one of which this is true.

And so, as we close the books on this Lent, there is only one question we need to ask ourselves, "am I more like Jesus today than I was on Ash Wednesday?" If so, "well done, good and faithful servant." But, if not, why not? Have we already been conformed to the image of Christ? Or perhaps we do think we deserve a little rest? Or perhaps we think we are "good enough?" I wonder what would be our fate if Jesus had decided he deserved to take a rest that Friday afternoon?

First Lesson

Isaiah 25:1–9

(The Lesson is written in the 25th chapter of the Book of Isaiah the Prophet, beginning at the 1st verse.)

O LORD, thou art my God; I will exalt thee, I will praise thy name; for thou hast done wonderful things; thy counsels of old are faithfulness and truth. For thou hast made of a city an heap; of a defenced city a ruin: a palace of strangers to be no city; it shall never be built. Therefore shall the strong people glorify thee, the city of the terrible nations shall fear thee. For thou hast been a strength to the poor, a strength to the needy in his distress, a refuge from the storm, a shadow from the heat, when the blast of the terrible ones is as a storm against the wall. Thou shalt bring down

the noise of strangers, as the heat in a dry place; even the heat with the shadow of a cloud: the branch of the terrible ones shall be brought low. And in this mountain shall the LORD of hosts make unto all people a feast of fat things, a feast of wines on the lees, of fat things full of marrow, of wines on the lees well refined. And he will destroy in this mountain the face of the covering cast over all people, and the vail that is spread over all nations. He will swallow up death in victory; and the Lord GOD will wipe away tears from off all faces; and the rebuke of his people shall he take away from off all the earth: for the LORD hath spoken it. And it shall be said in that day, Lo, this is our God; we have waited for him, and he will save us: this is the LORD; we have waited for him, we will be glad and rejoice in his salvation.

Gospel

St. John xx. 1.

THE first day of the week cometh Mary Magdalene early, when it was yet dark, unto the sepulchre, and seeth the stone taken away from the sepulchre. Then she runneth, and cometh to Simon Peter, and to the other disciple, whom Jesus loved, and saith unto them, They have taken away the Lord out of the sepulchre, and we know not where they have laid him. Peter therefore went forth, and that other disciple, and came to the sepulchre. So they ran both together: and the other disciple did outrun Peter, and came first to the sepulchre. And he stooping down, and looking in, saw the linen clothes lying; yet went he not in. Then cometh Simon Peter following him, and went into the sepulchre, and seeth the linen clothes lie, and the napkin, that was about his head, not lying with the linen clothes, but wrapped together in a place by itself. Then went in also that other disciple, which came first to the sepulchre, and he saw, and believed. For as yet they knew not the scripture, that he must rise again from the dead. Then the disciples went away again unto their own home.
